Hyperwords. Hyperwords is a Firefox and Flock add-on that turns every word into a hyperlink. When you double-click any word, Hyperwords pops up a menu of related items: searches, definitions, maps, shopping, and more. If you want to select a two-word phrase, like a name, double-click between them to search for that string. When the menu pops up, click the menu item that interests you to get more information. Hyperwords can search sites like Dictionary.com, Flickr, Slashdot, Yahoo Maps, and more. Additional functions include blog posting and translation.

Greasemonkey. View Web sites the way you want. This Firefox extension lets you add scripts to any Web page so you can customize its look and feel.

Google Toolbar. This new upgrade to the Google Toolbar for Mozilla's Firefox browser features enhancements to the search box and an antiphishing feature.

With its enhanced search functionality, the toolbar is able to offer suggestions on the fly for narrowing queries and correcting spelling. The search box also retains the user's previous query terms, as well as bookmarks, and offers them up as query suggestions. A drop-down menu lets users choose to run a query on different Google search sites.

The Firefox toolbar also now comes integrated with what Google calls its Safe Browsing extension, which previously was offered as an optional add on. This feature alerts users when it determines a Web page they are visiting could be a phishing trap. These are legitimate-looking Web sites that look to be from institutions such as banks that fraudsters set up to attempt to trick users into disclosing sensitive information, such as account numbers and passwords.

SeaMonkey. Defying convention, a group of volunteer developers has revived the former Mozilla suite to create SeaMonkey, a free program that combines the Mozilla browser with an enhanced version of the Netscape Messenger e-mail client, the ChatZilla IRC chat program, an HTML editor, and other tools for Web developers. Despite a few rough edges, the product should appeal to anyone looking for an all-in-one package. Note: Because SeaMonkey is a volunteer, open-source project, users can be assured of frequent (almost daily) updates that fix bugs and enhance features.

Mozilla Firefox. Firefox, a browser from the Mozilla team, packs a wallop but steps lightly on your system memory. Firefox organizes your windows in a tabbed interface, which makes your surfing easier and leaves your taskbar blissfully unburdened. The mouseless navigation and the built-in Google taskbar makes your searches shorter. Firefox's pop-up blocker lets you allow important pop-ups through while keeping ads from exploding in your face. And AutoDownload makes downloading files from your favorite sites simple. The browser's real power, however, is in its wide variety of extensions, which let you mix and match the features you want.
