

Ground Rules -1

- Click/Left Click means single LEFT Click
- Double Click – means double LEFT click
- **Right** Click – means single **RIGHT** click
- *Select* means move mouse over item and single LEFT Click
- *Send Tools/Options* means
 - Move mouse to *Tools*
 - When a submenu appears
 - move mouse to *Options* and left single click
- The screen shots have been "Cropped" and enlarged to show the area of interest. They are NOT, necessarily, the FULL screen shot
 - Windows screens will be different on different computers
 - Yours may have more or less items than these screen shots
- The name of the button/item to select/click appears in *italics*.




Ground Rules -2





What is Chrome

- Chrome is a Web Browser similar to Internet Explorer (IE)
- It is a *tabbed browser*, like IE7 (and IE8)
- It is smaller and faster than IE
- It allows *Extensions*
 - Which add to the features available
 - Which slow down Chrome
- It processes web pages differently than IE
 - Malicious code, targeted towards IE, will be ignored by Chrome
 - Some Web Sites will only work with IE (or Chrome with *IETAB* Extension)



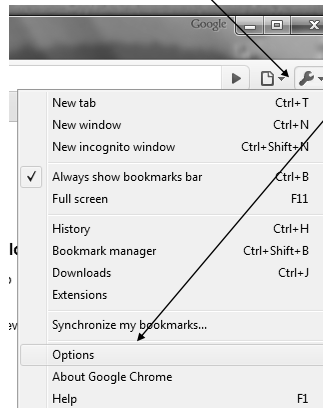
Downloading Chrome

- Open your browser
 - In the address bar type *www.google.com/chrome*
 - Click on the *Download Google Chrome* button
 - Click on *Accept and Install*
 - If you get a Security/UAC Popup – Select *Run*
- When download is complete
 - Chrome Will Install Automatically
 - Chrome Will Start Automatically
 - Uncheck *Make Chrome your default browser*
 - Click on *Start Google Chrome*

- Click on the “Wrench” (Upper Right hand corner), Select Options

■ *Basics* Tab

- In Class, Select “*Make Chrome my Default ...*”

 - Scroll down to *Downloads*
 - *Select Browse*
 - *Scroll up to Desktop*
 - Select and Click OK

Setting Up Home Page(s)

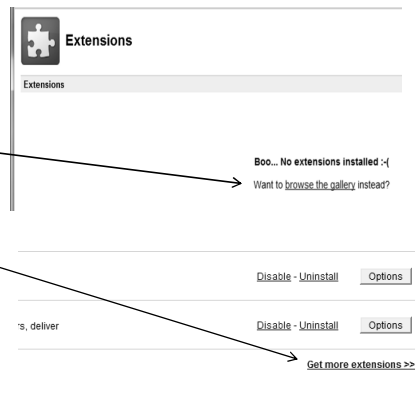
- If you wish to always have Chrome open multiple tabs.
 - Open each desired tab, in turn, by
 - Typing Ctrl+T (To open a new tab)
 - type the desired URL in the address bar
 - Tap *enter*
- Click on the *Wrench*
 - Select *Options*
 - Select the Basics tab
 - Click on *Use Current*

Adding an *Extension* -1

- Click on the *Wrench*, Select *Extensions*
- Select *Browse the Gallery* —
 - Get more Extensions from the bottom of the Extensions Tab



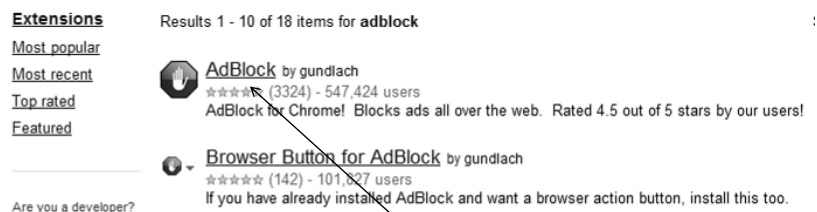

Adding an *Extension* -2

- Use the Search feature to find desired Extensions
 - E.g. *Adblock*
- Single Click on Extension Link

- Click on Install again (if required)

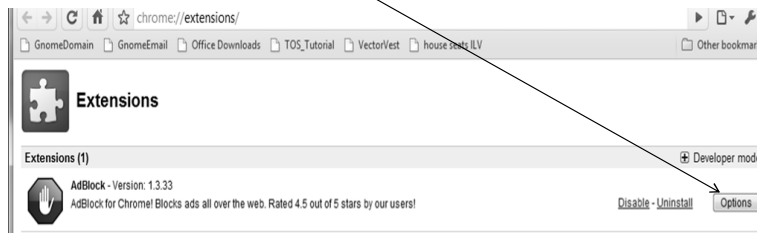

Adding an *Extension* -4

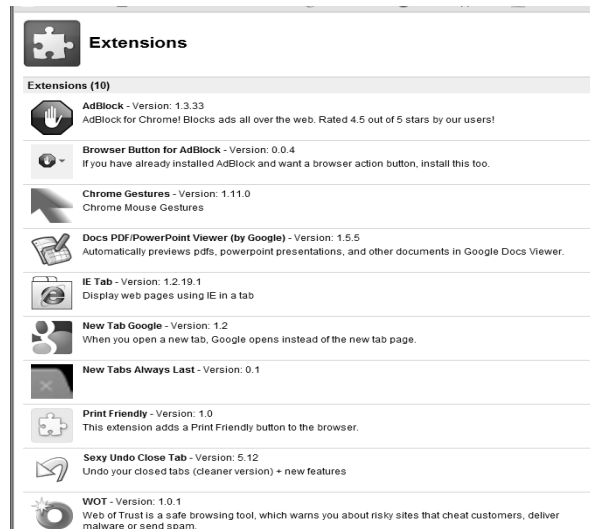
- To set up Extension Options

Using IE Tab -1

- If you have gone to a site which only works properly with IE:
 - To check to see how site works with IE, click on IETab Icon → 
 - You can switch back again the same way.
 - If you wish to always open this site in IETAB
 - Right Click on IETab, Select *Options*
 - Copy URL from address bar of desired tab
 - Paste here and click *Add*

Using IE Tab -2

- Registration

- You do not have to register to use *IETAB*

Using Extensions

- To Modify the way an add-on works

- Click on *Tools/Extensions*
- Right Click on an *add-on* and select *Options*

- Each time Chrome loads it will check for updates to itself and all your Extensions.

- If you have a lot of Extensions, this may slow down time to start Chrome

Chrome Tips

- To change size of display
 - Control + Middle Mouse Wheel
 - Control + or Control –
 - Control 0 resets size
- If you are viewing a secure/encrypted site, a padlock appears at the extreme right of the address bar

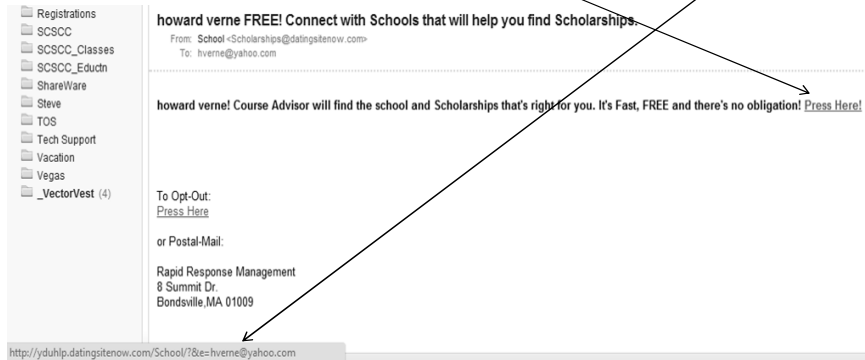

- Check Lower left hand portion of screen

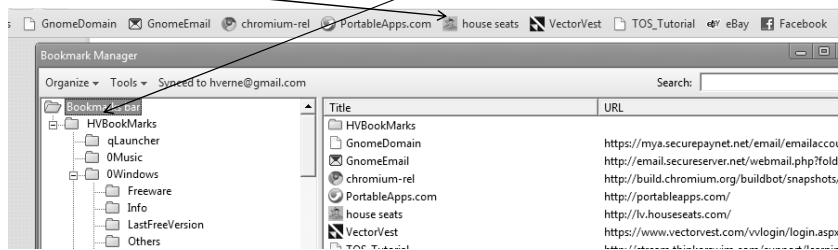

 - Note that contents of *Bookmarks Bar* appears here

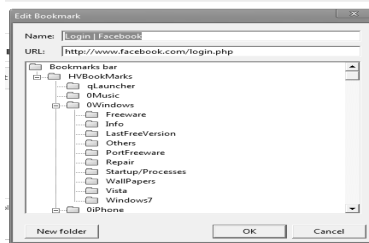
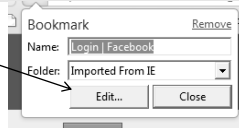
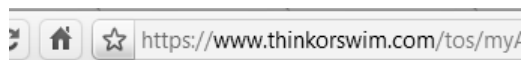


Bookmark a page
